Lloyd Wyborney was a life-time resident of Wilbur. He passed away February 12 as Lincoln Memorial Hospital, Davenport. Lloyd was born June 11, 1908, to J. R. and Lillian Wyborney and attended the Columbia School near his home and also attended Wilbur High School.

He was a member of the Withur Lutheran Church, a past member of the American Legion Post of Wilbur and a member of the Albert J. Gyorfi Post, V.F.W., of Wilbur. He served as a fireman with the Wilbur volunteer fire department for many years.
