Battalion T. J. Sokol of New York, (Group, Unit 23). Group organized under name of Kutnohorskeho. Master uniform colors on silk of gold and silver; a bronze gymnast (sokol) figure on a mast representing the fraternal Prazske order. A battalion of 500 members and such member purchasing his own uniform in the New York membership. Meeting held on May 21, 1877, Monday in Turnhalle Lodge on Street 4.

Sattalion 37: A. Wokal

Born in Caslavi in the year 1847. Came to America in 1863. In year 1867 became a member. Voted as an officer in 1870 and 1885. From year 1869 to 1889 was an officer.

Ferd Ruzicka: Born March 26, 1855 in Caslavi. Came to America in 1875.

Joseph Bunata: Born November, 1847 in Kresetecech in Kutne Hory. Came to America in 1870. In 1878 became a Sokol member. In year 1880 became an officer.

*Stanielav Vyborny (Wyborny): Born in 1854 in Hore Kutne. In 1872 moved to America and in 1886 returned to the old country.

Martin Hlavacek: Born Nov. 11, 1850 in Tetelicich in Klatco. Came to America in 1867. Died in 1869.

August Tesar: Born April 17, 1862 in Hore Kutne. Came to America 10 years later. In year 1878 madeapplication to become a Sokol Member. Seven years later voted as an officer, which office he kept.

Jan Pulec: Born Sept. 8, 1851 in Plichticich in Klatov. Came America in 1870. Joined Schols nine years later, becoming an officer in 1883.

Jan Corney: Born in Dobropul, District of Cesko-brodsky. Came to America in 1880 and in the same year joined the Sokols. Six years later became an officer.

Tom V. Prach: Born June 20, 1885 in Krasavcich, Plzensky, Country of Bohemia (Czechoslovakia). Came to America in 1879. A year later—(unfinished article).
