

MILITARY FUNERAL IS HELD

Legion Officials at Burial of Henry Wyborne

WILBUR, Wash., Nov. 8.—George Thompson post, American legion, yesterday officiated in a military burial of Henry Wyborne, 87. Mr. Wyborne, a native of Bohemia, came to America when 4 years old and to Wilbur about 15 years ago. He was a member of the Phil Corners post, G. A. R., and was one of four brothers enlisting as volunteers in the Civil war, serving under Sherman. Several years ago he took up his residence at the Soldiers' home in Orting, following the death of his first wife. At Orting he remarried and his widow survives him. Other survivors are five sons and four daughters by the first marriage, including Milton Wyborne, Virginia; Mrs. Anna Sedivy, Nebraska; Charles Wyborne and Joseph Wyborne, Wilbur; Henry Wyborne, Del Rio; Albert Wyborne, Mrs. Clara Brigstock, Mrs. Josephine Fox, Mabton; Mrs. Helen Davis, Bovli, Idaho; a brother, Bradick Wyborne, Minnesota; several grandchildren and several great-grandchildren. The Rev. Jenson Turner gave the funeral sermon, a chorus from the Christian church sang and the pallbearers were four of Mr. Wyborne's sons and two grandsons. The funeral was held in the Community church and was largely attended.
