

# Dies Suddenly

## Rites to Be Held at Chapel Monday

Sidney Bert Wyborney, 60, of Route 1 west of Mason City, died suddenly at 10:30 p.m. Thursday at the Lehigh Portland Cement Company plant where he had been employed the past 22 years as an electrical engineer.

Mr. Wyborney was born July 13, 1891, near Plymouth, the son of Frank and Catherine Bohack Wyborney. He grew to manhood at Plymouth and lived there on a farm until 1917 when he entered the military service and served overseas.

Following his discharge in 1918, he resided in Mason City. He was married to Blanche Coonrod Sept. 26, 1920, at Nashua. He was a member of the First Methodist Church.
